Types of PTSness

- A Current Connection: Being associated with or connected to a suppressive person in his present time environment.
- A Past Suppression: Someone or something in the present time environment reminds them of a past suppression, or

Types of PTSness

• **Antagonism:** A person can become PTS by reason of being connected to someone that is antagonistic to him.

- a. To be PTS in the first place, the PTS must have committed overt acts against the antagonistic source.
- b. When one has committed such acts his confront and responsibility drop.

Overt Act

- 1. An intentionally committed harmful act committed in an effort to resolve a problem.
- 2. That thing which you do which you aren't willing to have happen to you.

Withhold

Any withhold comes after an overt act.

Thus, an overt act is something *done*; a withhold is an overt act *withheld* from another or others.
